PASTORS CORNER: HELP WANTED! HYPOCRITES NEED NOT APPLY!!

Matthew 7:1-6 is probably one of the most well known and most quoted passages in the entire Bible. It is quoted by both Saints and Sinners alike - "Judge not, that ye be not judged." I'm amused by the number of times, in over 20 years of ministry, that I've heard



non-church-going Sinners quote this verse — and they tend to quote it with more ecclesiastical authority than the most faithful, well trained, well-versed, saved, sanctified, fire-baptized, Holy Ghost-filled, footwashing, tongue-talking Child of God! However, as we

properly study this passage in the context of Jesus' amazing discourse (i.e., the "Sermon on the Mount"), we will come away with a greater understanding of this classic Text.

Contrary to popular thinking, this Text is not a blanket prohibition against all forms of criticism and judgment, nor is it a hiding place for Saints and Sinners to retreat when caught with their hands in the proverbial cookie jar. Instead, with further investigation, we've discovered that what King Jesus prohibits in this Text is HYPOCRITICAL FAULT-FINDING! You do know what HYPOCRISY is, don't you? HYPOCRISY is saying, teaching and/or promoting one thing, while doing the exact OPPOSITE. In other words, you are engaged in HYPOCRISY when you do not PRACTICE what you PREACH (Matthew 23:3 NIV)!

The Greek word King Jesus uses in this passage for "Judge" means "to separate, determine, or to assume the office of a judge." It also means "to condemn or to give sentence." In light of those definitions, no Christian can "Judge" anyone, because no Christian has the POWER to condemn, sentence or send anyone to heaven or hell. Jesus, the Son of God, is the only one who is able to do this type of judging (John 5:21-23). Consequently, Saints are called to "judge" for the sole purpose of IDENTIFICATION & PROTECTION, so as to avoid being misled or deceived by others (Matthew 7:15-20). This is why King Jesus said "...a tree is KNOWN by its Fruit" (Matthew 12:33).

When you read the four Gospels, you will discover that King Jesus was intentional about condemning hypocrites. The Gospels record Him addressing hypocrites (i.e., the Pharisees and Sadducees, who were the religious leaders of the day), over 20 times. Hypocrisy is especially grievous and displeasing to God because the hypocrite PRETENDS to be righteous for the purpose of making him or herself look good. King Jesus called this behavior SIN (Matthew 23:27-28) because it involves PRIDE & LYING.

Hypocrisy is also especially displeasing to God because the hypocrite winds up leading others astray by his or her example! This is why King Jesus admonishes the hypocrite to "...first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye" (Matthew 7:5).

PASTOR'S CORNER (CONT'D): HELP WANTED! HYPOCRITES NEED NOT APPLY!!

The Christian's lifestyle has always been a stronger witnessing tool than mere words. This message is often overlooked in this spectacular Text. King Jesus wants us to use the power of our EXAMPLE to heal, correct, restore and help our fallen, lost and hurting Brothers and Sisters. This is why King Jesus commands us in the Text to "... REMOVE the speck from our brother's eye." Don't just stand there CRITICIZING a Sinner or someone who needs help. If King Jesus helped you get your sight back, now He requires that you do the same for someone else!

When you study this Text you will discover at least 3 wonderful truths. First – King Jesus shows us that our Brothers and Sisters NEED

our help. Second — King Jesus COMMANDS us to help our Brothers and Sisters. And Third — He QUALIFIES & EMPOWERS us to help our Brothers and Sisters. As you read this article, just know that King Jesus has raised you up for "such a time as this" (Esther 4:14). He has already saved, sanctified and brought many of you into His Kingdom (Matthew 5:3-10). You are a SURVIVOR and you already have a TESTIMONY! King Jesus now wants to use you to HELP somebody else. In the words of the old Hymn, "Lift Him up by living, as a Christian ought, let the World in you the Savior see; Then men will gladly follow Him who once taught, I'll draw all men unto me. Lift Him up..."

HEALTH CORNER: SEPTEMBER IS PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Prostate Cancer is a story of both great heartbreak and great hope. The heartbreak is that each year more than 29,000 men will die of this disease and that prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death of U.S. men. However, if diagnosed early, the five-year survival rate is almost 100 percent. At ten years post diagnosis, 98 percent of men diagnosed early, remain alive.

Prostate cancer is an extremely complex disease—multiple subtypes of this cancer exist, some aggressive and lethal, others non-aggressive and non-life-threatening. The vast majority of prostate cancer occurs as an indolent, slow-growing form of the disease that poses little threat to men's lifespans. Because one in seven men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime, it is important for men to learn about both non-aggressive, slow-growing forms of prostate cancer and aggressive forms of this disease through conversations with their doctors.

Prostate cancer is the second most prevalent form of cancer, after melanoma, in men—a nonsmoking man is more likely to develop prostate cancer than he is to develop colon, bladder, lymphoma and kidney cancer combined. While projected prostate cancer deaths have been reduced by more than 50% in the last two decades, reality is still worse for African-American men. Research shows that African -American men are 1.6 times more likely to be diagnosed with prostate cancer and 2.4 times more likely to die from it than Caucasian men. Although scientists do not yet understand why prostate cancer incidence and death rates are higher among African American men, it is widely believed that a combination of genetic differences, lifestyle and nutrition habits, and medical care may all play a role in the statistics. But for any man of any race, there are things you can do to better your chances for living a life free of prostate cancer:

Maintain a Healthy Diet. A low-fat diet with more than five servings of fruits and vegetables is considered healthy. Current thinking is that a heart-healthy diet with caloric control might also help prevent many cancers. Studies have shown that antioxidants, like sulphorophane found in broccoli, act like a sponge, mopping up molecules that can cause prostate cancer. Pomegranate juice also contains antioxidants that may help prevent the incidence of this disease.

Avoid Charred Meats. Cancer-causing molecules similar to those found in cigarette smoke are contained in charred meats. They accumulate in the prostate just like cigarette smoke carcinogens collect in the lungs. There they can interfere with normal DNA processes, creating mutations that can contribute to the formation of prostate cancer. Altering how you cook meats can greatly reduce these hazards. Consider wrapping meat in foil before grilling and flipping meat multiple times to minimize charring. Marinating meats can also help prevent charring.

Man Up. Get Your Annual Screening. Detected early, prostate cancer is 100% treatable. But often, it has no symptoms. That's why it's particularly important for African-American men, given their higher probability of developing prostate cancer, to have a proactive plan.

Howard University Hospital Cancer Center offers free prostate cancer screenings the 3rd Wednesday of every month from 1 pm to 3 pm. To make an appointment, call 202-806-7697. Children's Church. Children's Church is committed to providing the Youth and Children of COZ with a substantive and meaningful Worship experience. Lessons and activities are prepared for our Youth and Children using age appropriate materials. This ministry takes place during Sunday Morning Worship Services and various COZ events. Christian Education. COZ's Christian Education Ministry is the teaching arm of our church that replaces the tradition of Sunday School. Through this ministry, Wednesday Night Bible classes are provided for all ages. Systematic curriculums designed to edify disciples, and equip them for ministry to others, are used in all classes.
